What data will we collect about you?

We collect:

- Name
- Address
- Date of Birth

- Telephone number
- Contact details for a personal reference
- Information about any medical conditions or disabilities that could affect you volunteering
- Any criminal convictions or cautions which are not protected from disclosure
- Emergency contact details

Depending on the role we may need to collect:

- Information to allow a check with the Disclosure Barring Service (DBS)
- A copy of your driving license

What will we use your data for?

We use your contact details in order to keep in touch about things that might affect your volunteering, such as your application initially. We need your date of birth as some volunteering positions are age-restricted.

To help make sure you can volunteer safely and we can make any adjustments you might need, any medical conditions or disabilities need to be declared beforehand. We need to check for criminal convictions and sometimes arrange a DBS check as volunteers will work with the general public, including young and vulnerable people.

Who will see your data?

Your data will only be seen by WBC library employee, but your phone number and email address to be shared with the stated libraries volunteer organiser to be able to communicate with you.

Why are we doing this?

When you are employed as a volunteer by West Berkshire Council's Libraries Service, you enter into a contract of employment which forms the basis of our processing of your data.

West Berkshire Council also process your data in its capacity as a Public Authority in order to run a library service in the public interest, for the benefit of residents and visitors.

How long will your data will be kept?

Your data will not be kept any longer than necessary. We will only keep your data for the duration of time you volunteer, after which it will be destroyed securely.

How is your data stored and processed?

Your data will be held on the Council's computer systems and will be protected using upto-date technical and organisational security measures.

Transfer overseas

Your data will not be stored or sent outside of the UK.

Your rights

You have a number of rights when it comes to the data we hold about you. These are detailed on our request form (www.westberks.gov.uk/dprequest) that also allows you to make a request for us to take action about something.

Complaints
